Hinal Vyas (wife of Dave from UQ) is with Property Direct, an NDIS Registered Provider and is part of Special Disability Accommodation (SDA) Smart Homes Australia aimed at getting younger disabled people out of aged care facilities into special disability homes that cater for their very high support needs. Houses have either 2 or 3 bedrooms (& a carer's studio) along with voice activated features. People can invest in these homes (from around \$400K - house only - to \$862K - house and land) with returns from 12 to 15% p.a. on a 20 year contract.
