



A meeting was held earlier this month with the members of the OH&S Sub-Committee and Shed personnel who are leaders on the use of machines and equipment. One of the Meeting's purposes was to find ways to review and/or assess the competence of those Shedders who use our various machines. The Meeting was very profitable and forward-looking and resulted in a plan to remind all Members who use our equipment the correct and safe way to do so. It also proposed a system of coloured dots to be placed on name badges that would indicate a Member's relative expertise on machinery, beginning with "green" for the lowest level of expertise and "red" for the highest. Further information will be given shortly on this system's implementation. One of the Shed's obligations is to ensure that all Members who attend the Shed and use equipment are safe whilst doing so, as health and safety matters are our highest priority. It is a long time since competencies of our Members have been assessed, so this review is well overdue.

Shed Members are asked to bring their own protective items (examples are noise reducing ear pieces and goggles) to the Shed when they plan to use equipment. This has been considered necessary as another practical way of limiting the spread of this respiratory Covid virus that can enter a person's body in various areas around the head.

In an attempt to expand the offerings of our Shed, it has been suggested that a Family History Group be formed. Shedders interested in this type of activity are asked to contact Tony Webb or myself at the Shed. Also, Tony would like any Members interested in participating in metalwork projects to contact him.

Our Shed and Pinelands Lions Service Club recently joined forces to run a fund-raising Bunnings BBQ. A Profit of \$740 was shared in accordance with the relative manpower provided by each organisation, with our Shed receiving \$400 and Pinelands Lions \$340. Thanks go to all the volunteers who participated on the day.

As the spread of this Covid virus is still rampant in Brisbane and other areas in Queensland, I thank all Members who have indicated to the Supervisors that they are "fully vaccinated", are practising physical distancing, practising personal hygiene by using the sanitizer that is provided, and for not attending the Shed if they are feeling unwell. Once again, our Shed's top priority is to ensure, at all times, the health, safety and well-being of our Members whilst they are at the Shed.
