For example, without Mike Langham finding and responding to many available grants our shed would not have the equipment we require to carry out the many projects that we do for the community. Maurice Millsom continues his contribution, in-conjunction with Sam Robinson with the organising of projects. David Lack for his tireless and often overlooked work as our OH&S organiser contributing to our safety. David Whittaker for the efforts he has made in sourcing guest speakers. These three members were all very active in contributing to the working of Sunnybank Shed and its impact on our community. This year we have not had a member looking after social activities, in fact this role almost disappeared due to Covid 19, however I would like to see someone take up this role on the committee with David Whittaker, Burt Beaumont & Warwick Veneables working as a sub committee.

TREASURER REPORT FY 2023

The SDCMS Treosurer's Report for the year ending 30 June 2023.

The net operating profit for the FY2O23 year is \$5,266 represented by total income of \$34,729 less total expenses of \$29,464. Principal items of income and expenditure are described below. Other income and expense items are listed in the Profit and Loss Report for the 2023 fiscal year.

INCOME

ATTENDANCE FEES: Total Attendance Fees paid on daily attendance basis by all Shed rnembers amounted to \$11,536.

GRANTS: Grants and major donations totaling \$9,217 were received and included:

\$2,195-AMSA: For First Aid and CPR Training of Shed members

\$2,272- Bendigo Bank: Purchase of new power tools for Wood and Metal Sheds.

\$2750-QLD Govt. Dept of Industry: For new chairs.

\$1,000-Australia Post: New shed-gas BBQ.

\$1,000 CBA local branches: Purchase stocks of Shed shirts.

BUNNINGS BBQ's: The Shed did not operate a Bunnings BBQ during the year but did support Pinelands Lions Club at two BBQ's. Income from profit sharing amounted to \$1,378.00

MEMBERSHIP FEES: Annual membership fees, including joining fees paid by new members, amounted to \$5,870. At year end the membership totaled 128 members.

DONATIONS RECEIVED: This account includes funds received as gratuities, as compensation for minor services performed for organizations or individuals and for hire of Shed equipment. The total funds received amounted to \$2051.

SALES OF SHED MADE GOODS AND SHED ITEMS: Total \$3,378. Goods made by the Shed included a physiotherapy table, mud kitchens and library boxes. The sale of small hand tools and powertools donated to the Shed plus small items of timber provided \$1,976 of the sales income.

EXPENSES

INSURANCE-\$3.836: The Shed has Public Liability of \$40 million under an umbrella policy administered by the Australian Men's Shed Association (AMSA).

In addition, our Shed has a seperate Industrial Risks Policy that provides coverage against materiol loss or damage to property up to the value of \$200,000.

MORNING TEA AND BBQ SUPPLIES:

\$5,942. Tea, coffee and biscuits, supplied in individual packages as required by Covid 19 regulations, were provided for Shed members at a cost of \$4,143.

Food and other supplies for the Shed BBQ lunch held on the last Friday of each month amounted to \$1,799.

This account also includes expenses related to the maintenance and repairs of Shed machinery. For FY2023, these expenses amounted to \$5,858.

STAFF WELFARE: \$5,647. Costs of running two First Aid & CPR Training courses (\$4,245), purchase of shed shirt stocks and miscellaneous member expenses.

SUPPIIES & MATERIALS: Includes the purchase of other materials and consumables for Shed personel and community project activities including construction and repairs. For FY 2023 these expenses amounted to \$5,858.

FIRST AID KITS & SUPPLIES: \$1,804. A new defibrillator costing \$1,700 was purchased.

GENERAL EXPENSES: \$1,821. Covers replacement of a stolen water cooler, hire of a skip for rubbish removal and payment for Bunnings gift cards.

ELECTRICITY: \$1,218. In February 2023, the installation of a I3.2kW rated solar PV cell electricity supply system was installed on the Shed roofs at a cost of \$20,000. The capital cost was paid from a grant provided by Brisbane City Council.

During the six months the system has been operating, the solar installation supplied 70% of the electrical energy consumed by the Shed. Our average monthly payment to our electricity supplier, discounted for feed-in energy was \$17.50 per month Based on current supply tariffs which have increased by approximately 30% since February 2023, our current bill for 100% utility supply to the Shed would be \$171.20 per month.

The principal expense items listed above cover 89% of the FY2023 expenses. The balance is spread across a number of expense accounts as recorded in the Profit and Loss Report for FY2023


