TREASURER REPORT FY 2023

NOVEMBER DECEMBER 2023

Total cash available - \$49.667

Income for November 2013 amounted to \$5,111 and included receipts of \$2,516 for a Bunnings BBQ manned by the Shed on Sunday 12th November. Grants from Sunnybank Community & Sports Club for \$670, and from BCC Lord Mayors' Community Fund for \$240 were received in November.

November expenses amounted to \$2,453. The Bunnings BBQ costs were \$781 which was partially offset by a grant of \$550 from the BCC Lord Mayors' Community Fund.

- 2. **Income for December** was \$2,135 with expenses amounting to \$2117. The Christmas lunch, held at the Shed premises on Friday 15th December, attracted an attendance of 66 rnembers. The lunch expenses were \$1,037 of which \$406 was subsidized from Shed reserves.
- 3. Attendance fees for the months of November and December amounted to \$2,167. The average weekly Shed attendance for November was 104 members and for December was 115 members.
- 4. The Profit & Loss Reports for November and December and the Balance Sheet Report at 31st'December 2023 are available from the treasurer.
